

# Of the Approximate 1,350 Municipalities in Pennsylvania with Populations Greater than 2,500, Lower Milford Ranks 17th Safest!

The, "30 Safest Places To Live In Pennsylvania—2016," was published on November 17, 2016 on the website of, alarmsystem *reviews.com.* According to the article, the list is compiled from the FBI's yearly **Uniform Crime Report** and other national data resources. This is a list of the 30 safest communities across the entire state of Pennsylvania with populations greater than 2,500. The State itself ranked 14 out of the nation's 50 when comparing the safest states although it came in 9th for population density. In determining the ranking, the rate of violent crimes and the rate of property crimes were tabulated for each 1,000 residents. Lower Milford rated 0.0 per 1,000 for violent crime and 2.3 per 1,000 for property crimes. The article describes our Township as, "... acres of preserved farms and undeveloped woodlands, the area is a showcase of Pennsylvania's fertile soil and fields and idyllic natural scenery." Wow! We couldn't have said it better. We can thank our Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors, past and present, for their good planning and hard work.



The Lehigh Valley Planning Commission as consultant for the six municipality regional planning group, conducted a survey last year and received a resounding message from residents to prioritize the preservation of farmland and open space. Lower Milford currently has 42 farms preserved totaling over 3,000 acres. The Lehigh County Agricultural Land Preservation Department is partnering with some of the municipalities, matching their contributions with County and State funds to preserve as much farmland as possible. Our Board of Supervisors voted to contribute \$25,000 in 2017 toward preserving more farmland. To quote from their website, "According to the American Farmland Trust, the United States is losing forty acres of farm and ranch land every hour to new development. Since 1982, America has converted 24 million acres of agricultural land to developed uses. This is roughly the size of Indiana and Rhode Island combined. "

#### Historic Entries from, "A History of Lehigh County Pennsylvania" published by James J. Hauser, 1902

- The Lehigh River was once called, the west branch of the Delaware
- In 1715, the first settlement was made near our Great Swamp Church in Lower Milford
- In 1725, the first school in Lehigh County was established which was connected with the Great Swamp Church in Lower Milford
- The real estate valuation of Lower Milford in 1901 was \$701,590. In 2017, it is \$466,583,900.
